
"House Hunters" in Janes Village.

The Neighborhood Report:

'm sure you have noticed. . There are some new businesses on Lincoln Ave. While most are in the city of Pasadena, their relationship to Altadena and, in turn, to Janes Village is obvious. As "Lincoln Village", the main corridor to our neighborhood, becomes more successful the likelihood of businesses being attracted to the area increases.

Perry's Joint is a wonderful spacious Coffee/ Ice Cream shop which features a jazz theme (personal bias freely admitted by this jazz musician). I have gone in there several times with my two young sons who, as you might guess, love it.

The Vintage Café (2032 N Lincoln) serves an eclectic menu, Bistro style, with an open kitchen and features live music every night except Monday. I, for one, am absolutely thrilled to have a place just 2 minutes from home where I can go listen to live jazz. I have gone in several times and have been very happy to see good sized and enthusiastic audiences. I highly encourage you to get down there and have a meal. Go for dinner and listen to some music. Bring your own wine until their license is approved. They open for breakfast every day at 7am.

There are several other businesses that have opened nearby, a furniture shop and a beauty supply, among others. Let's support these local businesses and hope that their success encourages other fine businesses to follow their lead into Lincoln Village.

If you put your ear to the rails you might hear the impending arrival of a large grocery store and fitness chain on the Northeast corner of Lincoln and Woodbury. No foundations have been poured yet but we are all watching those empty lots with extreme interest. -ZM

Historic Janes Village is now a Non-profit Corporation

istoric Janes Village, our official corporate entity, is in the process of becoming a non-profit organization. This step will allow us to apply for different kinds of grants and will allow all of us to write off donations to Janes Village on our taxes. This will be especially valuable as we try to solicit donations from local businesses.

One of the most important steps in the forma-

tion of our organization is the creation of a board or directors. This will be a group of interested individuals who will help focus the organization. The board will also watch over our finances and ensure that everyone is acting in the best interests of the neighborhood. Ideally the board will eventually come to include a select few members from outside the neighborhood who can consult the board on issues of historic preservation or who might have useful political influence at the city or county level.

The board will meet infrequently and it will be a great opportunity for neighbors to get to know one another and help in the development of our neighborhood.

Nominations for the board of directors are currently being accepted, especially self-nominations, and a board will be elected at our next community meeting on March 13th at 2pm. There is no question that this is due in large part to the historic designation obtained in September 2002. The spotlight of buyer interest has been sharply focused on us, every properly priced Janes Cottage has received multiple offers and they usually sell for above the asking price.

Recent sales include 3201 Olive at \$565,000, 3168 Olive at \$501,000, 3052 Olive at \$525,000 and our current record holder, 3058 Olive at \$610,000. (We are told the new owner of that home is a landscape architect and it will be exciting to see the transformation of the front yard.)

A New Record Setting Price

As wonderful as that \$610,000 sale is, we're about to see that record broken. We recently opened escrow on 376 W. Poppyfields and while we can't share the sales price until the transaction closes, it will establish a new standard for Janes Village. It's important to keep in mind, however, that both 3058 Olive and 376 Poppyfields have been expanded and are on extra large lots. Additional square footage and additional baths were added, the exterior elevations of which are generally in keeping with the original architecture.

Preservation Pays

Remember, one way to ensure you maintain top value if you add square footage to your home, is to follow the original architectural lines as much as possible. Yes, this generally adds to the cost of construction, but the payback is greater than the cost. Putting a 'stucco box' on the end of a peak-roofed Janes Cottage is a sure way to lower your property's value. Other 'improvements' which can turn out be detractions are vinyl or aluminum windows. The buyer of a historic home is usually looking for original windows or, if replaced, for new wood windows which match the old. Yes, they are more expensive and often have to be custom made, but the value that is added to your home generally more than pays for this.

Pretty Sells

You may remember the old saying, "You never get a second chance to make a first impression." This is so very true in real estate. We can't tell you how many times buyers have told us to keep on driving when we've pulled up in front of a house with dead grass, no trees or peeling paint. We try to help them look past that and tell them how wonderful the house is otherwise, but that first impression can either make you or break you. And let's face it, not everyone in Janes Village keeps their homes or front yards in the best shape.

When is the Bubble Going to Burst?

What bubble? We just had a wonderful presentation by Leslie Appleton-Young, the Chief Economics of the California Association of Realtors whose general assessment is that prices, while high, are being supported by strong underlying market conditions. She also stated that while we don't have a crystal ball to see the future, mature real estate markets don't generally burst. The stock market is a different story, as we've all seen over the last few years. Remember, the terrible real estate market of the early to mid 1990's was painful and prices fell a total of about 25% to 30%. However, it took about 5 years for that to happen, with prices falling a little bit each year until the bottom came and prices stabilized and moved back up.
